## Overview of the Seventh Nunavut General Election

- **September 22, 2025:**
  - The Chief Electoral Officer issued 22 writs of election to Returning Officers.
- **End of candidacy period:**
  - 58 candidates were confirmed across 22 constituencies.
  - candidate in Netsilik withdrew.
  - 2 constituencies were acclaimed, meaning only one candidate ran and was declared elected automatically.
  - Voting was held in 20 constituencies.

### Voting Participation

Early voting was actively promoted to:

- a) Elders
- b) Out-of-community residents
- c) Students
- d) Mine workers
- e) Incarcerated voters

48% of registered voters cast a ballot.

### Judicial Recounts

Returning Officers for Aggu, Pangnirtung, and Quttiktuq applied for recounts since the margin between first and second place was within 2%.

- Pangnirtung: Results unchanged.
- Quttiktuq: Results unchanged.
- Aggu: The judge ruled a tie.

### New Election in Aggu

- Because of the tie, a new election for Aggu was held on December 15, 2025.

Canada Post Strike affected the special ballots.

## **Introduction of the Office of the Chief Electoral Officer**

The Office of the Chief Electoral Officer, operating as Elections Nunavut, is an independent entity of the Legislative Assembly of Nunavut. Under the stewardship of the Chief Electoral Officer, the office is mandated to administer territorial and municipal elections, by-elections pursuant to the Nunavut Elections Act, and plebiscites governed by the Plebiscites Act. In accordance with a distinct agreement, Elections Nunavut also oversees the conduct of local option liquor plebiscites under the Liquor Act on behalf of the Department of Finance.

The Chief Electoral Officer is appointed by the Commissioner of Nunavut for a term of seven years and is directly accountable to the Legislative Assembly through the Speaker. This direct line of accountability safeguards the non-partisan administration of elections and plebiscites, thereby preserving the integrity of Nunavut's democratic processes for all Nunavummiut.

The Management and Services Board exercises oversight over the fiscal and human resource frameworks of Elections Nunavut. The Chief Electoral Officer is statutorily required to submit annual reports to the Legislative Assembly and to provide additional reports concerning specific electoral and plebiscitary events.

These reports often include recommendations aimed at improving the legislative and procedural frameworks governing elections and plebiscites in Nunavut. Elections Nunavut also supports the Boundaries Commission by offering comprehensive GIS and mapping services; the Commission, in turn, is responsible for conducting public hearings and advancing recommendations related to electoral boundaries and constituency nomenclature. The upcoming review by the Boundaries Commission is scheduled to commence in 2032.

Elections Nunavut maintains robust partnerships with public and private sector stakeholders to ensure the effective and efficient delivery of electoral and plebiscitary processes. Essential services, including legal counsel, information technology infrastructure, geographic information system support, audit services, and electronic voter database management, are secured through external professional service agreements.

Headquartered in Rankin Inlet, Elections Nunavut comprises four permanent staff members. During the preparatory and post-event periods surrounding electoral activities, the staff complement is augmented to around 200 through the engagement of casual employees and contracted election officers.

## **Enforcement Protocol**

- In August 2025, the following parties entered into a new Enforcement Protocol:
  - Chief Electoral Officer
  - Integrity Commissioner
  - Royal Canadian Mounted Police
  - Public Prosecution Canada
  - Government of Nunavut – Department of Justice

### **How the Enforcement Protocol Works Under the Nunavut Elections Act**

#### **Foundation: Memorandum of Understanding**

The enforcement protocol is built on a memorandum of understanding (MOU) that defines the roles and responsibilities of each party involved in administering and enforcing the Nunavut Elections Act. This MOU ensures everyone understands their duties and how they coordinate during investigations.

#### **Investigations and Enforcement**

The protocol lays out the step-by-step process for handling potential contraventions of the Act, including:

- How investigations are initiated
- How information is gathered
- What enforcement actions may follow

These actions can range from warnings to more formal measures, depending on the severity and nature of the contravention.

#### **Authority of the Integrity Commissioner**

The Integrity Commissioner holds the ultimate authority to decide what action should be taken when an alleged violation occurs. This includes the power to:

- Determine whether a contravention has occurred
- Decide on appropriate enforcement measures
- Enter into compliance agreements with individuals or entities to resolve issues without further penalties

## Information Sharing

### Vital Statistics

The Department of Health, Vital Statistics division provides Elections Nunavut with information on deceased residents of Nunavut. This information sharing is guided by an MOU and is authorized under Section 42(3)(e) of the *Nunavut Elections Act*. Elections Nunavut uses this information to update the voters' lists.

### Electoral Boundaries

The election was conducted in accordance with the electoral boundaries established by the Boundaries Commission during 2022–2023 review and tabled in the Legislative Assembly. These boundaries came into force the day following the dissolution of the Sixth Legislative Assembly.

## Outreach, Resources and Logistics

### Human and Venue Resources

**Returning Officers:** The Chief Electoral Officer appointed 22 Returning Officers (ROs), one for each constituency. The term of their appointments ends one year after the General Election. Five 2-day training courses were held during August and September 2025.

**Assistant Returning Officers:** 39 Assistant Returning Officers (AROs) were appointed. The term of their appointments concluded the day following the election. AROs participated with the ROs during the 2-day training sessions in August and September 2025.

**Deputy Returning Officers & Poll Clerks:** Returning Officers appointed 38 Deputy Returning Officers (DROs) and 40 Poll Clerks (PCs) after the writs were issued. The term of their appointments ended the day following the election. The DROs and PCs attended 1–2-day training sessions presented by the ROs and AROs in each constituency.

**Registration Clerks:** Returning Officers appointed 39 Registration Clerks (RCs). The term of their appointments concluded the day following the election. The RCs participated in the 1–2-day training session with the DROs and PCs.

### Office and Voting Locations

During the election periods, the office of the Returning Officer is a location for the public to obtain information on the electoral process, register to vote or make changes to their registration, and vote in advance voting opportunities.

The office is also where prospective candidates, financial agents and campaign managers can obtain information on participating in the election and submitting the candidate's declaration of candidacy.

An office was secured for every constituency. For the most part, these offices have been consistently used in previous events to establish location memory. In communities with more than one constituency, the returning officers shared the location to centralize the electoral activities.

During the advance vote in certain communities and on Election Day, larger voting venues were secured to accommodate the increased number of voters who typically vote on these days.

### **Social Media**

Elections Nunavut expanded its digital presence by modernizing its website and actively using Facebook, Twitter and Instagram to share both territory-wide and community-specific election information. This aligns with our broader effort to make voting information more accessible across remote communities.

### **Technology**

#### **At the Polls**

Voterview replaced paper polling records with an electronic voter data management system that enabled real time information sharing between field and headquarters staff. Poll staff could add, search, and strike off voters electronically, allowing voters to cast ballots at any open polling station and enabling remote poll stations to operate simultaneously with central poll stations.

#### **Online Candidate Portal**

Candidates who requested voters list were provided with access to voterview to download the voters' list for their constituency and had the functionality to extract information on who voted. Paper copies were available for those candidates who requested them. The voterview access provided the opportunity for candidates to observe voting progress remotely during voting.

#### **Online Voter Registration**

In addition to registering in-person, voters had the opportunity to register or update their voter registration online via the website of Elections Nunavut.

#### **Online Application for Special Ballot**

Voters can apply for a special (mail-in) ballot electronically through the Elections Nunavut website.

### **Alternative Methods of Voting**

In addition to the traditional method for voting in-person at a polling location, Elections Nunavut offered alternative voting choices for all Nunavut voters.

**Special Ballot- Mail-in**

This method accommodated voters who were away from their home communities during the election period. A ballot was sent to the voter at their destination and had to be returned prior to the close of polls on Election Day.

**Special Ballot- Emergency**

Voters who were unable to vote on Election Day because of an unexpected absence or who were in a remote place and unable to vote were permitted to vote by telephone.

**Mobile Poll**

Election Officers brought the poll to the residences of those who were unable to attend a polling location in-person due to mobility or other challenges.

**Canada Postal Strike**

The distribution and receipt of Special ballots as well as VIC cards was affected by the strike. Elections Nunavut coordinated with Canadian North and Calm Air Cargo to ensure the ballots were sent to different communities and other jurisdictions.

Purolator courier as well as local courier companies were used to ensure ballots were sent out to the voters in the south.

**Voting in the Office of the Returning Officer (VORO)**

In communities that hosted a Returning Officer, in-person voting was permitted for VORO over 10 days leading up to Election Day.

**Advance Vote**

In communities that only hosted an Assistant Returning Officer, in-person voting was permitted for one day, a week before Election Day.

**Voter Data Management System**

Elections Nunavut maintains the voters list in an electronic database Voterview hosted by DataFix. Voterview permits election officers to register new voters, change voter information, and strike off voters during elections and plebiscites. During an election, candidates are provided with access to a portal which allows them to retrieve specific information on voters in their constituency including name, address and if they have voted. If a candidate does not have access to the portal, an encrypted electronic copy is provided. After the election, the candidate is required to destroy the list or return it to Elections Nunavut.

**Voter Information Card**

Voter Information Cards (VIC) were mailed to each registered voter during the election period. The VIC contains the voter's name and address and provides information on where and when voting in their constituency takes place. If the information is incorrect, the voter can contact an election officer to make amendments. If the voter no longer resides at the postal address, the post office returns the VIC to Elections Nunavut for further investigation.

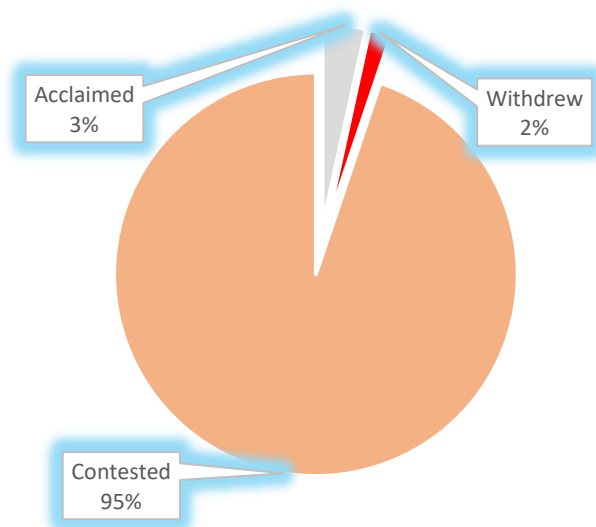

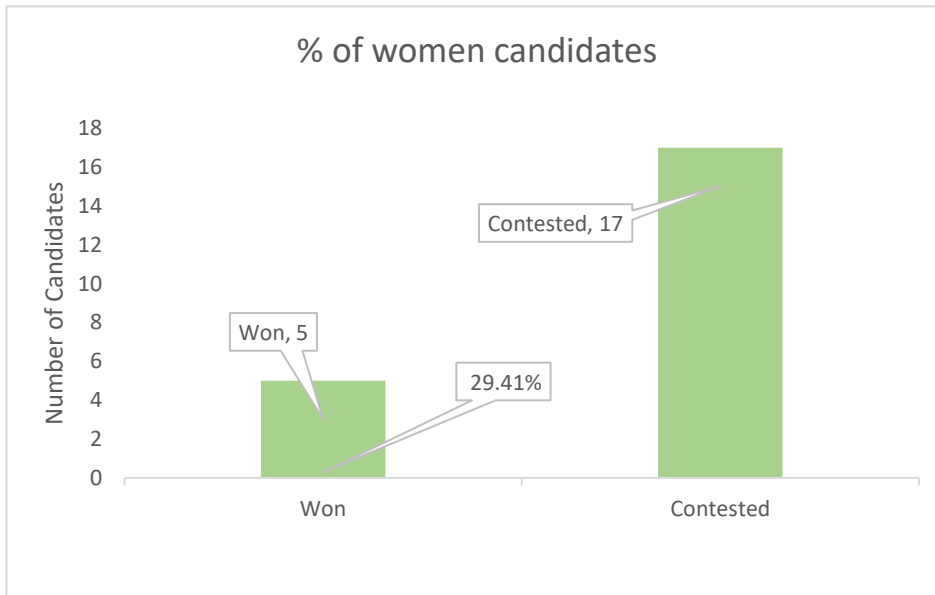
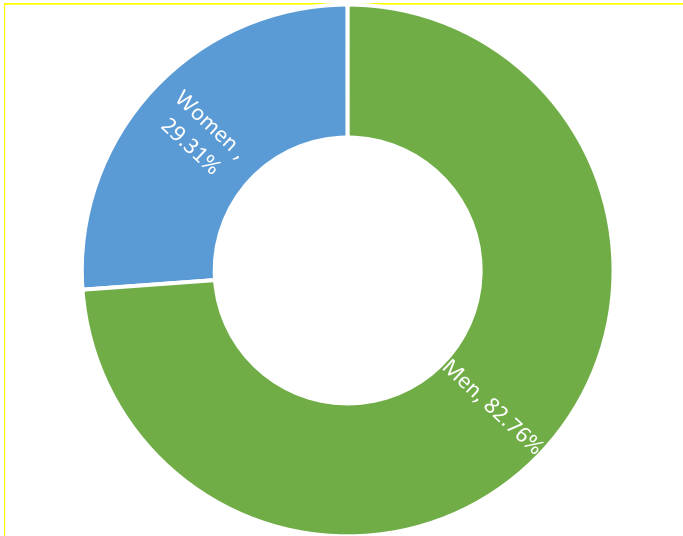

## Gender Analysis

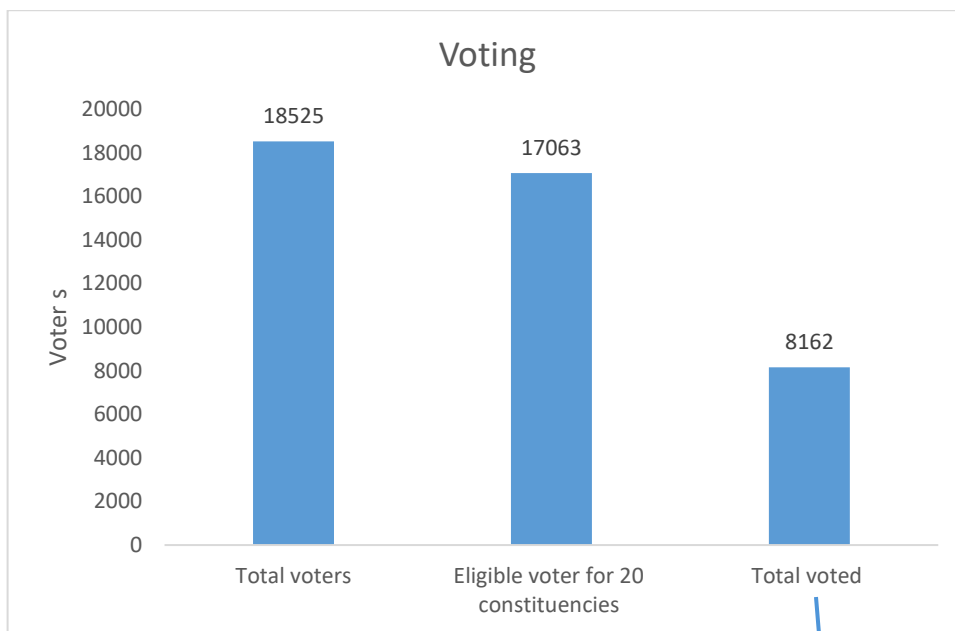

## **Appendix A: Summary of Complaints, Investigations and Prosecutions**

### **Complaint #1**

The Chief Electoral Officer submitted a complaint to the RCMP. This was based on a complaint 'Notice of suspected ineligibility' received from the Returning Officer of the constituency of Netsilik, that a candidate of Mary A Neeveacheak of the community of Taloyoak, an employee of public service not obtaining leave of absence approval as per the public services act.

The candidate subsequently withdrew.

Outcome: RCMP investigated the matter and no charges were laid.

### **Complaint #2**

A complaint against Graham from CBC North was filed with the RCMP by the Chief Electoral Officer. Graham was taking pictures and video recording inside the polling station in Rankin Inlet.

Conclusion: RCMP investigated the matter and no charges were laid.

### **Complaint #3**

Based on the information provided by the RO of Pangnirtung a complaint was filed with RCMP by the Chief Electoral officer, that two voters aged 17 registered and voted on Election Day.

Result: As of writing this report, we have not yet heard from the RCMP.

### **Complaint # 4**

The Chief Electoral Officer was informed by the RO of the constituency of Aggu that a 17-year-old voter registered and voted on election day. The CEO filed a complaint with the RCMP that this is in violation of section 242(1)(a) of the Nunavut Elections Act.

Result: As of writing this report, we have not yet heard from the RCMP.
